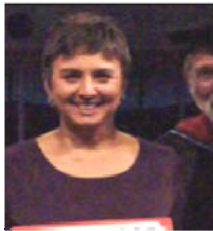


I am a Chaplain or I will become a Chaplain because of:

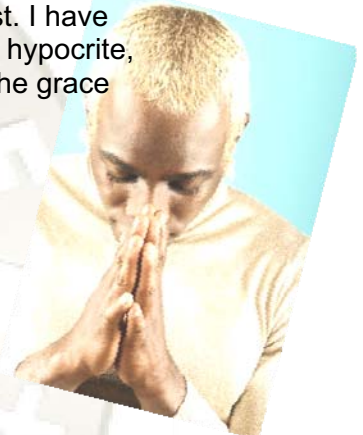

I was there, but I was free of depression because I chose God to reign in my life while in that dungeon.

If we are going to be "Warriors" for God, then we have to be determined in our ministry to win souls for the Kingdom. We have to be determined not to compromise until the victory is complete. The wounds that we receive as a warrior will result in others being saved, as we share our testimonies. I am very happy to have taken this first part of the Making of a Chaplain Class.

On March 1st of 1992; It was in an unfortunate accident which placed me in a wheelchair. I was shot on the right side of my head causing brain damage. This left me paralyzed on the left side of my body.

I was shot by a .25 caliber handgun that suddenly discharged from my father's hand. I was placed at St. Joseph's Barrows Neurological Center, where I spent eight days in a coma having violent seizures regularly. The doctors gave my family little or no hope at all that I would survive.



My mom spent every moment by my bedside reading the Bible and praying. She told me later that even though I was physically unconscious she knew my soul could be strengthened and nourished by the Word of God. I was released from the hospital and give God all the praise and glory for my miraculous recovery.

Now I want to become a Chaplain and serve the needs of others in my Community. To provide hot meals to the homeless, give advice, guidance, instruction, spiritual counsel and prayer at the acceptable place and time. My desire is to bring the blessings of comfort, love, strength and mercy through the grace of God and His Son our Savior Jesus Christ.

I have become a Chaplain because of... For most of my life I have been misguided and have had no spiritual direction. My parents did not teach me how to deal with issues in childhood and how to protect me from the world and the situations that I would encounter through my teenage years. I wasn't "raised" so to speak; I just simply grew older. I had gone with my mother to church occasionally as a small child but didn't understand why I was there or what the purpose it served. I went to make my mom happy. I have always had a yearning to understand what I felt was missing in my life. It was that sort of emptiness inside that could not be filled except in a relationship with Jesus. My past became a tool to use to help other men overcome struggles in their life.

Internship and Certification Program Requirements:

- Must be born again, Spirit-filled Christian.
- Must have graduated from "The Making of a Chaplain" Course.
- Agree to and sign Phoenix First Assembly **"Statement of Understanding"**.
- Agree to and live the **"Chaplains Hold to These Biblical Standards"**.
- Must be willing to provide spiritual support for individuals of all faiths.
- Must have 4 references including two Pastors from Phoenix First or a local recognized Church.
- You will be assisted in becoming Ordained by a nationally recognized faith group, if this is your desire
- A background and credit check will be required.
- Develop a plan of action for your internship for approval by the Chaplain Coordinator.
- Must have one year in ministry service (after graduating from "The Making of a Chaplain" course) including but not limited to 460 hours (9 hours per week) of hands on training, conducting services such as Baptism, Communion, funerals and death notifications and 140 hours of study, worship, and prayer. DOES NOT INCLUDE ATTENDING CHURCH SERVICES OR CHRISTIAN TV
- Complete Monthly Activity Time sheets. Exact records must be kept by the student of all their intern activity hours and turned in monthly.
- Attend 11 required Chaplain Continued Education Classes (approx. 2.5 hours long).
 - Four lessons will be from a series by Cleansing Stream Ministries.
 - Four lessons will be from the book "The Bondage Breaker" and workbook by Neil Anderson.
 - Three lessons will be on John Bevere's book "The Bait of Satan" and workbook

History

The Independent Assemblies of God was birthed in the year 1918 as the Scandinavian Assemblies of God in the United States of America, Canada and Foreign Lands. It existed under this name from 1918 to 1935.

In 1935 at an annual convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota the Scandinavian Assemblies of God merged with a group called the Independent Pentecostal Churches. The name of this new fellowship was, and to this day remains, the Independent Assemblies of God International.

Dr. A. W. Rasmussen, D.D., was the Founder of the Independent Assemblies of God. He is now deceased and with the Lord. His ministry spanned the globe for over fifty years. He developed and supported missions, orphanages and churches in Canada, the Philippines, India, and throughout the world.
